I had been putting this day off. After my Davy Crockett inspired slog from the ferry terminal into the Western Washington University research facility (SSCHOA Newsletter Summer/Fall 2011), I was not so eager to continue the mission from WWU to our community gazebo. What might be skulking under the cover of those thickets, brambles, and branches waiting for me? Certainly more bogs. Definitely more slippery slopes. Absolutely more scrapes and cuts! Hungry coyotes? Rabid beavers? Giant attack squirrels? Hmmm.

Then, St. Patrick's Day dawned. Throughout the day, brisk 30 knot winds out of the southwest rattled our windows and Mother Nature, that fickle exterior designer, delighted herself by constantly rearranging the deck furniture. Rain pelted the rooftops. It was chilly. Inspiration struck. It was time to complete the mission.
