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### Spring 2014 Landscape Update

Spring has arrived! Each day new shades of green appear as trees and scrubs and grass and yes, even those pesky weeds, start the 2014 growing season. Here in Sunset Cove we have several landscape related issues that continue to need our attention.

# Community Common Area Maintenance:

The Green Street Yards crews are back for 2014 and have begun working in the common area medians and cul-de-sac gardens. Near the end of 2013 a new gravel trail – including a drainage system – was installed, linking the "upper" trail to the gazebo. Recently, additional cobble rocks were spread in the medians.

#### Vacant Lot Mowing:

Vacant lot owners, it's not too early to make arrangements for 2014 mowing and noxious weed control. Last year several property owners found it difficult to make last minute arrangements after the lots grew thick with weeds and tall grasses. Keep in mind that it is not just a CC&R rule to keep the lots mowed;

it is also a Municipal Code requirement (against allowing noxious weeds and grasses to grow). Please plan ahead.

# Curb Trees Along Washington Boulevard:

Last summer, the Board took quick action to combat an infestation of Pacific Coast Pear Rust disease in some of the trees planted along Washington Boulevard. While the disease may not have been in all the trees, all were in danger if even a few were affected. Consequently, all trees were sprayed. In an effort to keep the trees healthy and disease-free, the Board recently approved that the trees again be sprayed, before they "bloom-out" this spring.

Meanwhile, originally the tree to be planted along the Boulevard was *Pyrus Calleryana*. Due to its general lack of availability, *Styrax Obassia* is recommended as the new choice for curb trees. They are similar in shape and appearance, and seem to blend well with the existing trees.

Reminder: all homeowner's are re-

sponsible for the maintenance and trimming of all curb trees and plants adjacent to their property. Branches should not extend over the street as they interfere with trash and street cleaning trucks. Low branches and plants over the sidewalk must also be kept trimmed to avoid interfering with pedestrian traffic.

#### Suggestion Project:

In an ongoing effort to keep our tree -lined boulevard and lush gardens the great features of our neighborhood that they are, we (the Board) are encouraging everyone to provide input as to what improvements and/or additions we should focus on, both this year and longer term. Ideas were discussed and solicited at the Annual Meeting, and will be discussed in detail at the monthly Board meetings beginning on March 20th. The Board will consider all ideas presented, so please plan to attend and participate.

  - Later this year we will all be receiving new garbage totes as the City converts to a new, fully automated pick up system. Garbage will still need to be bagged, however.

- and yard waste (all garbage must be bagged or bundled). Quantities are limited to one load per household, and proof of Anacortes residency will be required.
