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## **Landscaping Updates**

Spring arrived early, and is fast turning into summer! Each day new shades of green appear as trees and scrubs and grass and yes, even those pesky weeds, gain ground in the 2015 growing season.

Here in Sunset Cove we have several landscape related issues that need our attention on an ongoing basis.

# Community Common Area Maintenance:

The Green Street Yards crews are back for 2015 and have begun working in the common area medians and cul-de-sac gardens. Late last year, an irrigation system was installed at the entrance median to Sunset Cove, as well as additional plants. All the medians were mulched, and several large and overgrown trees were removed from the Washington Boulevard medians.

# Curb Trees Along Washington Boulevard:

The Board recently approved the spraying again of the trees along Washington Boulevard before they "bloomed-out".

The spraying was done in order to combat an infestation of Pacific Coast Pear Rust disease which was discovered in some of the trees a couple of summers ago. While the disease may not have been in all the trees, all were in danger as the disease is highly contagious. Consequently, all trees were sprayed in an effort to keep the trees healthy and disease-free.

At the same time, the median trees were sprayed to combat tent caterpillars, which had been seen on a few trees.

A reminder about the curbside trees: all homeowner's are responsible for the maintenance and trimming of all curb trees and plants adjacent to their property. Branches should not extend over the street as they interfere with trash and street cleaning trucks. Low branches and plants over the sidewalk must also be kept trimmed to avoid interfering with pedestrian traffic.

### Median Lighting:

Part of the attractiveness of the boulevard medians are the lights, and this past winter all of the bulbs were tested and the majority of them were replaced. Damage to the bulbs — whether due to careless deer, the bulbs themselves overheating, or overzealous maintenance workers — have really made an impact the past few years. But now they are all working again!

### Tree Stakes:

Many trees within the association have stakes and support posts around them. The rule of thumb with most profession-

al landscapers is to keep these in place for one year. Some feel two years are better, if extreme winds are an issue.

Most of these stakes have been in place in excess of these time frames. If you have stakes around your trees and the trees have not been compromised and are growing well, it might be time to remove them. The ties between the tree and the stakes can end up choking the trees and scarring them.

Also, leaving them in place too long does not allow for the tree to build up it's own strength to brace for windy conditions and an occasional deer rub! Of course, leaving the deer guards around the trees in this area is necessary. (Thank you to Jean Warner for this item.)

### Vacant Lot Mowing:

Vacant lot owners, it's time to make arrangements for 2015 mowing and noxious weed control, if you haven't already. Sometimes it becomes difficult to make last minute arrangements after the lots grow thick with weeds and tall grasses — so, don't let this happen to you!

Keep in mind that it is not just a CC&R rule to keep the lots mowed; it is also an Anacortes Municipal Code requirement (against allowing noxious weeds and grasses to grow). Please plan ahead.

#### Gazebo and Trail:

The gravel path to the gazebo is due to be refreshed this summer. All neighbors with encroachments along the path will be notified to make room for the contractor's equipment. Thank you, in advance, for your cooperation!

- Now that we have the new garbage totes (since the City converted to a fully automated pick up system) it is more important than ever for the garbage to be bagged. The recycling trucks have gotten better about slowing while emptying the front loader, which has minimized paper blowing around. The Anacortes Solid Waste crew reminds us to also put our garbage cans about 3 feet apart at the curb, before 7am on pick-up day (Fridays).

- for the City of Anacortes. It is even better to go slower than that, especially when "kid-alert" symbols are out indicating children are riding bikes and playing nearby.
- Please don't feed the deer! Some neighbors have noticed others actively feeding the deer which roam our yards, and have expressed concern that the leftover food scraps may be inviting rats and other vermin to take up residence.
