Treasurer Update

- ➤ The 2022 budget was distributed in the annual mailing in December and was voted on by return mail of the ballots.
 - The vote to approve the 2022 budget was unanimous
- ➤ For the year ending December 31st 2021 we went over the projected budget by a small margin due in part to the following:
 - Tree assessment
 - Sundown Court refresh
 - Additional landscaping
 - Legal fees
- ➤ The budget for 2022 is balanced with the transfer of \$1,000 from the reserve account to cover anticipated legal fees.
- ➤ A tracking mechanism to track disbursements has been implemented to track funds allotted to various projects such as the WA BLVD refresh and tree replacement project along with other scheduled projects for 2022 and beyond.

- ➤ Total assets on hand as of January 1st, 2022 are \$43,756.67.
- The Board is researching options to improve the ease of use of our aging mailboxes. Problems exist with the locking mechanisms on both sides of the box(s). We are currently researching options to repair and or replace the existing boxes. As we finalize our plans we'll keep the owner group in the loop.

- The creation of our 5 year plan is well underway. We are creating a procedure manual and calendar of events for SCHOA financial management. Reporting and processes are being automated to streamline the treasurer workload for future boards.

- ➤ The landscape committee has solicited maintenance bids from a number of local landscapers. After the due diligence review of the quotes was completed we awarded the 2022 business to ProScapes. Paul Allen assisted Steve Krippner in the process.
- In the landscape maintenance quote/bid process Steve and Paul assembled a map of Sunset Cove outlining each area with specific tasks and expectations. This levels the playing field going forward with the checks and balances in place to monitor the quality of service we receive from our new landscape maintenance supplier i.e. ProScapes.
- ➤ The native plant list will be placed on the website soon. Steve and Linda Krippner have assembled the list based on WA State guidelines along with a nuanced approach to our immediate area.

We've also got kids and adults playing in the streets which supports driving at the speed limit or below.
- Yard maintenance-As temps begin to increase it becomes increasingly important to stay on top of yard maintenance. Mowing, pruning and debris removal from your yards is a must. Should you be struggling with yard maintenance the Board can recommend a number of local landscapers and maintenance companies to use.
- ➤ Habitat for deer-We all enjoy seeing deer in the immediate area. That said, let's not make it a practice to feed them. Rats, mice, etc. also like what deer eat; lets avoid an infestation by not feeding them.



Frash disposal and pick up-Friday is trash pick up day for our neighborhood. Let's respect the appearance of Sunset Cove and bag all trash for pickup. Lets also be mindful of returning trash cans to an area on your property not visible to the public. For large trash and debris removal you can also use the following facility:

- For those of us that walk pets in the neighborhood it is our responsibility to clean up after them. Let's all pitch in!

Spring Best Practices

Spring Maintenance Checklist

- Inspect gutters for debris and damage
- Inspect exterior windows and doors for damage and wear
- Inspect roof and siding for damage
- Inspect underground sprinkler system and make ready for use
- Inspect decks/railings and clean and or refinish as needed
- Inspect for pest infestations
- Clean out interior HVAC vents
- Change furnace filter(s)
- Change batteries in smoke alarms and carbon monoxide detectors
- Clean lint trap from dryer vent
- Tune up power equipment: Change oil, spark plugs, sharpen blades and chains, remove old gas before starting
- Check garden hose connections, insert new washers if needed
- Rake up debris, moss and dead grass from lawns
- Remove dead plants from landscape
- Fertilize lawn
- · Add mulch to garden beds and other landscaped areas

- Prune trees, shrubs & grasses growing into your house or garage
- Remove frost covers from exterior hose bibs when temps allow
- Clean grill(s) and check propane connection
- Fill or replace propane tank(s)



SHOW GARDENS: (Garden Rosalyn, RoozenGaarde and Tulip Town)

Check out Garden Rosalyn, Tulip Town (tuliptown.com) and RoozenGaarde (wnewtulips.com) on pages 2 and 3.All three charge admission, have FREE PARKING and acres of tulips to see. FIELDS of THURS

These are the crops of RoozenGaarde. They are planted to harvest and use both the bulbs and flowers. The field tulips bloom in April, but weather determines exactly when. You can check

bloom status at www.tulips.com/bloommap. Information about admission to the fields is also VERY CHANGEABLE. PLEASE check before you come so you know what to expect! Remember, we love our April showers, but many times those showers mean the tulip fields are not accessible because the soil is too wet.


LEASE NOTE:

DETAILED Trave DIRECTIONS

These detailed instructions should help you get from I-5 Exits to the tulip growing area. Exits 230 and 221 are recommended during peak travel times (weekends, Fridays and Mondays).

Burlington Exit

Exit 1-5 and head west on SR 20 toward Anacortes
Proceed west on SR 20 for 3 miles until you reach Best Rd/Form To Market Rd; Turn
Left on Best Rd and proceed 1.7 miles until you reach McLean Rd. This will put you
at the McLean Rd roundabout, in the center of the tulip growing area. There are
numerous routes you can follow — consult the Festival map to decide.

Conway Exit

Exit off Interstate 5 and head west toward LaConner

Proceed approximately 0.1 mile. Enter the roundabout and turn onto Fir Island Rd and proceed west 5.1 miles where the road curves to the left and up an incline to a bridge over the Skagit River. Cross the bridge and continue for 3.1 miles when you will arrive at the intersection of Best and Calbour roads. You are now at the southern edge of the tulip growing area. From here, use the Festival map to visit events and activities, your favorite field or the gardens, Garden Rosalyn, RoazenGoarde and Tulip Town.

Mount Vernon Exit

Turn right onto S Third St for 0.3 miles, then

EITHER continue onto W. Division St for 0.5 miles (you will cross the Skagit River) Turn Left anto S Wall St; Wall St turns into McLean Rd in 249 feet; Continue on McLean Rd for 2.5 miles.

OR continue onto W Division St for 2.3 miles (you will cross the Skagit River)
Turn Left onto Avon Allen Rd for 1.1 miles; Turn Right onto McLean Rd and proceed
1 mile to Beaver Marsh Rd.

At this point you can turn Left onto Beaver Marsh Rd and proceed to RoozenGaarde and Garden Rosalyn. Or, you can proceed on for 1 mile and turn Right onto Bradshaw Rd and proceed to Tulip Town.

Use the Festival map to locate where you are and proceed to SR 20 and east to 1-5. If you decide to leave via Fir Island Rd to the south, we suggest you consider using the following route from the intersection of Fir Island Rd and Pisoneer Highway: Enter the roundabout and turn onto Pioneer Highway and proceed south 2.3 miles; Turn left onto Millown Rd and proceed east 0.9 miles. This is the intersection of 1-5 and Exit 218. From here you can proceed north or south on 1-5 to your end destination.





8 Things To Do this Spring In The San Juan Islands

Flowers blooming, wildlife returning, and sunshine streaming

San Juan Islands-8 Things to do This Spring

1. Roll into Spring at the Tour de Lopez

In springtime, you want to get outdoors and breathe. Taking your bicycle on the ferry means one less car on the road, more fresh air and exercise for you and your family, and a more intimate experience with the sea spray, wind, trees, birds and scents of the islands. One day a year, the Tour de Lopez bicycle rally celebrates the landscape of Lopez Island, with its stunning vistas and rolling hills. Three different routes—5, 12, 18 & 31 miles—take riders of all levels past beautiful views, ending with a fresh, locally grown lunch, music and a beer garden.





2. See Majestic Wildlife in their Natural Habitat

The San Juan Islands are a wonderful place to see all kinds of wildlife from birds to foxes, stellar sea lions to whales. Lime Kiln Point State Park is one of the best places to see or a whales from shore. Tour the lighthouse and listen to the whales from the hydrophone! You can also ride with expert whale and wildlife tour operators to gain a new perspective, Join a larger tour with up to 80 people, or a smaller boat with up to six people, and explore the he waters of the Salish Sea. You'll visit inlets and passages filled with natural beauty, history, and wildlife of all kinds. Whether you find a pod of orca whales or a humpback passing by, a porpoise playing in your wake, or a gimpse of a minke whale, you're sure to find adventure in the islands. Zip up to Canadian waters or down to the southern tip of San Juan Island near Cattle Point Lighthouse, where seals and sea lions Ioll on distant rocks. Onboard naturalists offer detailed information about the habitats and behavior of animals in this rich ecosystem.

3. Visit a Working Lighthouse at Lime Kiln Point State Park

just a short walk from the parking lot at Lime Kille Point State Park, a.k.a. Whale Watch Park on San Juan Island's west side, you can stand on the rocky promontory and see a richly diverse environment, from rocky shoreline to wooded uplands. Orcas, minke whiles, porpoises, seals, seal isons, and river otters cruise the shoreline through kelp beds and eel grass, looking for food. Eagles and seabinds reel overhead. The lighthouse was built in 1919 and still serves as a navigational beacon for ships in the Haro Strait and offlers sours during the summer. The park is considered one of the best places in the world to view whales from land, and there are a small seasonal gift shop and interpretive center where you can learn more.





4. Watch Spring Bloom at the San Juan Islands Sculpture Park

Walk among massive sculptures and discover hidden artistic gems at this 20-acre outdoor art experience. Bring your dog on-leash and wander through more than 125 unique sculptures in a beautifully landscaped setting. Follow the mapped and marked trails down to a view of beautiful Westcott Bay. 7. Take a Hike with Stunning Views

The San Juan Islands are a hiker's paradise, and each Island offers a different experience, from mountain trails to beach walks, passed waterfalls, and mossy boulders. On Lopez Island, hike or bike Lopez Island, and mossy boulders. On Lopez Island, hike or bike Lopez Hill, a 400-acre preserve with a range of trails, from simple to steep, that can be strung together for longer, more challenging hikes. Orcas Island offers Moran State Park and Obstruction Plass State Park, each with Stumming views and serene forest trails. Washington State Ferries

Getting here is half the fun aboard a Washington State Ferry! Take a scenic ride through the islands as you make your way to your final destination. You can drive your car right onto the boat, or board as a foot passenger and simply walk on. The ferries run year-round and there are several sailings each day to and from each of the four main islands - Lopez, Orcas, San Juan, and Shaw. An interisland ferry allows island hoppers to travel between the islands and an international ferry offers service to Sidney, B.C. March - December.

All San Juan Islands ferries depart from the Anacortes Ferry Terminal located at 2100 Ferry Terminal Rd, Anacortes, WA 98221. Allow a comfortable 2 - 3 hours to enjoy the drive and the scenery from Seattle or Vancouver B.C. Make sure this includes enough time to arrive 30-minutes before departure for your reservation check-in.
